

Scholarship honors a young life of kindness and passion for cars



Kody Wiltse was known for his daily gestures of kindness and for his extraordinary mechanical talents and skills. For his family, co-workers, and friends, Kody was the most selfless person they have ever known. "He could fix anything and make it better," shared his father, Keith, about Kody's ability to work on cars and motorcycles. His mother, Mia, shared that he purchased his first car, a 1968 Dodge Power Wagon, at age 11 and a Plymouth Duster at age 14. "He was a great saver, and his abilities were uncanny, and awe-inspiring to those around him."

Childhood friend Brody Steffey recalls working on cars with Kody growing up and sharing many memories in his dad's shop. "We had talked about working at Discount Tire together as kids and ended up being hired within a couple of weeks of each other," Brody shared.

Roux Willmott, manager of the Renton Discount Tire and Kody's supervisor for three years, said Kody was a great teacher and coach to the other automotive technicians. "His goal everyday was to provide top service to customers, top quality, and safety," Roux said. "He made everyone around him better and never let anyone go backwards in what they delivered. He was an amazing individual."

It was at the tire store across the street from the college that former Renton Technical College tutor and Computer Network Technology graduate Billy Ray learned how beloved Kody was and about the motorcycle accident that had taken his life in August 2023. That's when Billy reached out to the family. After touring RTC's automotive program and learning more about scholarships through the RTC Foundation, Mia and Keith embraced the idea of setting up a memorial scholarship in Kody's name. Now students like Randy Lee, a fall quarter recipient of the Kody Wiltse Memorial Scholarship, continue Kody's legacy of excellence and dedication to the automotive trade.

Randy lost his job in aerospace during the pandemic and came to RTC to reinvent himself and find a career path in the automotive industry. He was recently accepted into the Rivian Training Program at RTC and believes, "This unique program makes me a more competitive candidate in the current job market." Kody's parents see the scholarship as a life-affirming way to honor what he meant to the people who knew him. "Helping automotive students is part of Kody's legacy to inspire future generations of car enthusiasts," they shared. "And it reminds us to pursue our dreams with unwavering dedication and selflessness."

The facilities are top-notch, with state-of-the-art equipment and teaching practices in place to help students succeed." Making impactful investments in communities where ITW Hobart Service operates is front and center for the global company. A transformative partnership: Interview with M. Trevor Bennett, Associate Vice President Acute Care Operations at Providence Swedish

Former Providence Swedish leaders Sherry Williams and Pam Gallagher Felt, now an RTC Foundation Board member, initiated the partnership.




