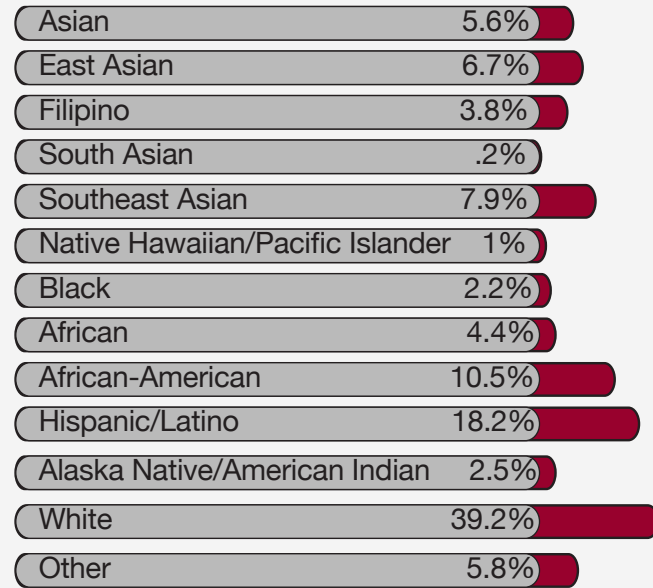


OUR DIVERSITY

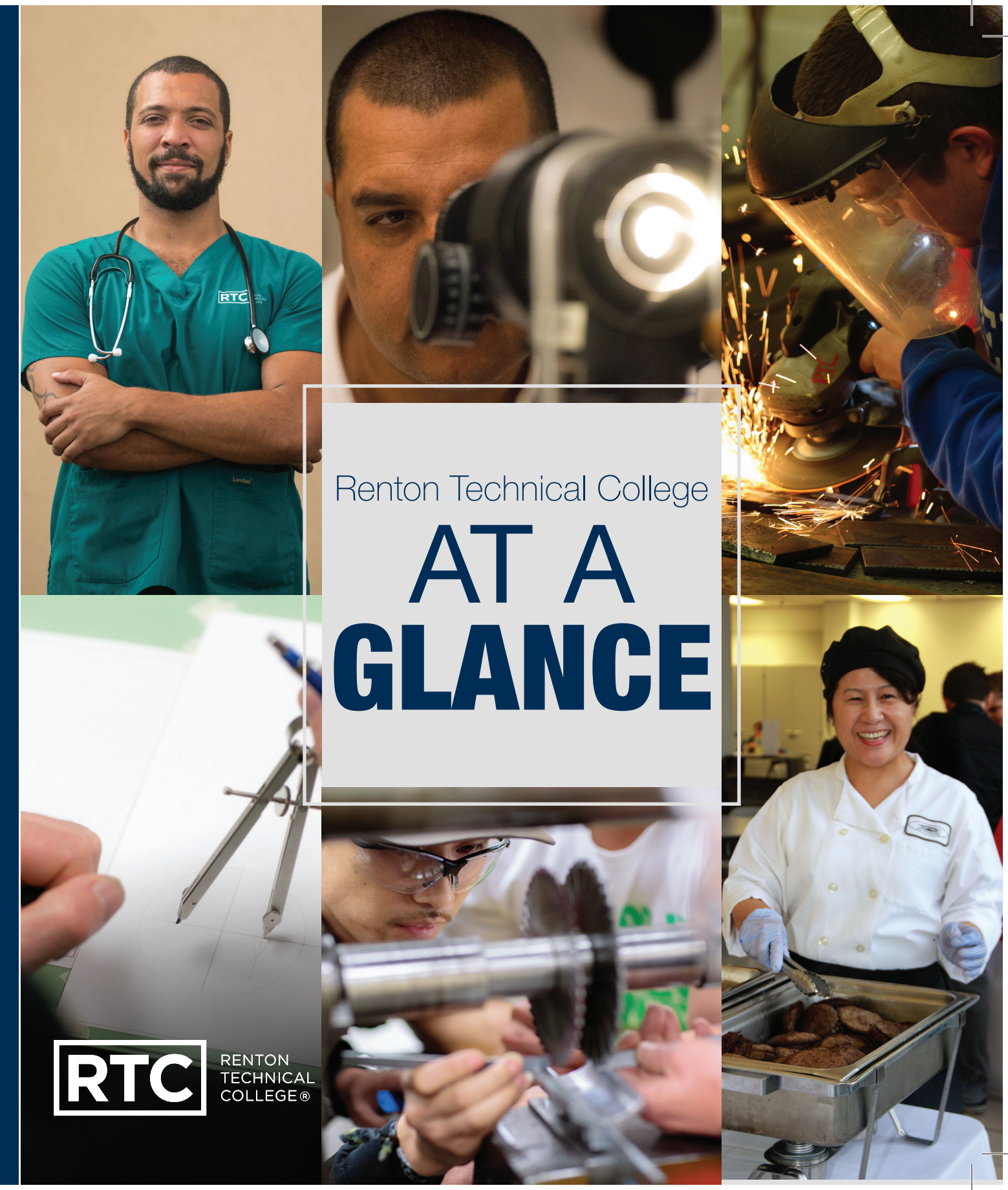
